

Federal Funding Program managed by EPA since 2014



RAE SNEP Watershed Grants: 2018 - 2021

- RAE/EPA Cooperative Agreement since 2017
- Awards 2018 -- 2021
 - 50 Grants
 - 100+ Grantees
 - \$10.3 M awards
 - \$5.9 M match
 - \$16.2 M total
 - Grants \$10k \$500k, most in the \$100k \$400k range
- Built on Foundation of EPA Grantmaking 2014 2016


Notes for 2022

- SNEP Strategic Plan Vision, Goals & Priorities
- Letter of Intent (LOI) as first application step
- On-line portal for applications and administration
- Broad review committee
- Coordination with SNEP Network
- More emphasis on underrepresented communities
- More emphasis on habitat & resilience
- More support for applicants & grantees
- Broad environmental monitoring or research ineligible
- Match waiver by request

June 30 Full Proposal Due

August Notification of Awards September Grants Announced



Successful Proposals

- Support SNEP Vision, Goals & Priorities
- Significant positive impact on ecosystems & communities
- Connection to water quality; holistic approach
- Build or support local and regional partnerships
- Build local & regional capacity
- Foster regional learning & expertise
- Strong outreach component general &/or technical
- Inform communities & community leaders
- Understanding of implementation



Foundations for SNEP Watershed Grants

- Identified Needs
- Regional or Watershed Plans
- Vulnerability or Resilience Plans
- New or Existing Partnerships
- Community Commitment
- Stakeholder Engagement
- Non-Federal Match



Things to Avoid

- Proposals that are not well connected to potential implementation
- Those without clear results or benefits
- Projects that ignore existing plans, ongoing initiatives or other potential connections
- Proposals that overlook obvious partnership opportunities
- Unnecessary competition within a small geographic area



Logistics

- Read RFP prior to on-line application!
- Grants are reimbursable
- 33% Match Required
- 2-year performance period
- Semi-annual reporting
- Quality Assurance Performance Plans (QAPPs) generally required
- Federal Funding Requirements Apply -- See RFP
- Applications can be developed over several cycles
- RAE can provide assistance

SNEP Network

- Provides training, technical assistance and capacity-building.
- Support can be coordinated with SNEP Watershed Grants.
- Use Network for SNEPWG project development, or to implement SNEPWG-funded plans and projects.
