Southeast New England Program (SNEP)
Watershed Implementation Grants
(SWIG) is a partnership between Restore
America's Estuaries and EPA New
England. SWIG grants support
communities working on high-priority
restoration projects to improve
communities and ecosystems in Rhode
Island and Southeastern Massachusetts.
While supporting local projects, SNEP
provides a regional framework of
coordination and information sharing to
elevate the practice of environmental
restoration throughout Southeast New
England.

- 33% non-federal match required
